We will examine two of Shakespeare's comedies and two tragedies. *The Merry Wives of Windsor* and *Troilus and Cressida* both explore the power of community to check the desires and shape the destinies of individuals. John Falstaff attempts to seduce Windsor's virtuous Mistress Ford, with hilarious results, while *Troilus and Cressida's* protagonists pay the bitter price of a fabled war that sours their love. *Romeo and Juliet's* young heroes are crushed by their ancestors' hatefulness and folly, while in *Timon of Athens*, Timon's noble, if deluded, experiment in fostering community through the power of money leaves him to end his days in bitterness against all humanity.
